For the first time there is talk of the possability of extending green points to County Congresses; it woyld be a pity if after all the yeare we have been trying to get this, we were to lose our Congress.

The only other Green point pairs event held in the Counties; Rothmans, has been discontmued for this coming season.

Your committee has met four times during the year and dealt with a great many matters of administration, I trust that they have done so to your satisfaction. That is leaving aside seleotion which is never done to the satisfaction of the majority, but representation of the county is one of our major objects and during the year a relevant account of Committee time has been devoted to this.

On the other hand thepprovision of County and Section Competitions to cater for the majority of the membership, has not been nelgected and we hope that members have had a good year's bridge.

I think our inost outstanding achievement this year has been the wimning of the Daily Mail Schools Cup by the team from Plymouth College. This team included a number of players who we financially assisted to attend the European Bridge Lesgue Junior Competition in Belgian last summer.

The winning of the E.B.U simultaneous Pairs by R.Blacknore and P.Orabtree also Lis a first for the D.C.O.B.A.

Other National events in whioh we shone were M.J.Allen coming 4th in the National Pairs with S. Preston.

The coming year will see the awarding of Green points for the County Fairs and Teams Championship, something we have been fighting for for many years.

Selection has been troublesome during the past year, but selection always is, but let us hope that this year is somewhat easier. However, most bridge in the Counties is non-selective and I hope that members have enjoyed it.

Though the general pattern of Devon operating as a separate County is now beginning to settle down; there still remain problems which need to be overcome.

The division of the County into four sections has had a good effect in the North, East and West; where sections are enjoying the major events being circulated through their areas and membership has grown as the interest has grown. In particular the Northern Section with new officers is very keen and anxious to enter as many events as possible.

The Eastern Section is growing steadily under the guidance of John Woolcott who now has an able treasurer, in Don McFarlane, to help him.

The Western Section seems to have filled all their available club spaces, but there are a lot of non English Bridge Union members in those clubs.

The Southern Section has suffered from the division, but the North and East were going to stand on their own feet sooner or later, and the division of the County into four sections has hastened this. Like the West Section they have plenty of club members in their only club, but they are not coming forward into the Devon County Contract Bridge Association and participating in Championship events.

In all sections we need to encourage club players to join the Devon County Contract Bridge Association and English Bridge Union and to enter their section Championships and go on through qualification to County finals.

As a whole the standards of play throughout the County are not as high as they should be, and it is only the competition to succeed and qualify and win at higher and higher levels which will bring us back to the higher standards of play and competition that we previously enjoyed.

All bridge players surely want to improve and play better bridge, like in any other game you only improve by playing with people who are better than yourself (and one day having the pleasure of beating them).

Our more experienced players should welcome less experienced players joining them, (it is no good the officers encouraging people if they are put off in their first ventures). We had good players enjoying their keener game, we can have them again but it requires three things, encouragement by the association officers, a willingness to move up by the club player and a welcome from our dwindling number of more experienced players.

Comparitively Devon has more than held its own in the last year by attracting some $8 \%$ of new members. In 1984 the year of the first "Bridge Week" - from 17 th -23 rd September - we must hope to do better not only in numbers but in ability and that applies to everyone from our Tollemache Team, who performed rather less well than we would have liked when thrown into competition with some of the more tigerish Counties, down to the more aspiring of our club members, not yet members of the County and National Association.

As is usual we are not pressed with volunteers for membership of committees, or to hold office at Section or County level. This does not make for enthusiasm where someone is "prepared to continue", and the vigour of the Association could be improved by some younger more active leaders.
Notwithstanding that I should like to thank our Chairman, Mrs Phyllis Jones, now retiring from the Chair after three years, and all members of the Committee for their hard work and valuable support throughout the year.

The Treasurer circulated copies of the year's accounts. She said that the figures were slightly better than last year's. The insurances were now centralised instead of in separate sections, which was obviously proving moze economical.
Mr. Fitman asked why the accounts for the Torquay Congress were not available. It was agreed that in future these would be made available at the A.G.M. He also asked why the accounts were not made available before the A.G.M. Mrs. Lamb said that there was difficulty in getting the accounts in from the sections in time to do this. It was even more difficult getting the Torquay Congress accounts early as this was not played until the end of March and the financial year for the Congress was not until the end of May. She said, however, thet she would do her best to get the accounts out as early as possible. Mr. Bell objected to the fact that nearly a third of our income was spent on sending top players to County competitions.
